This appeal by Appellants Preservation of Los Olivos and Preservation of Santa Ynez, which the Board dismissed for lack of standing, 42 IBIA 189 (Feb. 3, 2006), has been remanded to the Board of Indian Appeals (Board) by order of the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California. ^{1/} That order granted the Department of the Interior's motion for a remand, directed BIA to file a supplemented and complete administrative record, and ordered the Board to "issue another order in light of the full record *at the earliest feasible time.*" Oct. 6, 2006 Order at 1, Preservation of Los Olivos, et al. v. U.S. Department of the Interior, No. CV 06-1502 AFM (CTx) (C.D. Cal.).


On December 8, 2006, pursuant to the Board's December 4, 2006 order soliciting proposed procedures on remand and allowing responses to the Regional Director's request to limit disclosure of certain documents, the Board received a Joint Report Recommending Procedures on Remand and Consent Motion for Enlargement of Time to Respond to Regional Director's Request to Limit Disclosure of Confidential Information. The Report recommends allowing Appellants and the Tribe time to review the supplemental record before proposing further procedures on remand.

The Board accepts the Joint Report and Consent Motion for Enlargement of Time. On or before January 12, 2007, the parties shall submit a joint report (if possible) or separate reports regarding their views on the extent to which, if any, additional briefing to

^{1/} The underlying appeal to the Board was from a January 14, 2005 decision of the Regional Director to accept a 6.9-acre parcel of land in Santa Barbara County, California, in trust for the Santa Ynez Band of Chumash Mission Indians of the Santa Ynez Reservation, California (Tribe).

the Board is necessary and appropriate on the issue of Appellants' standing, including a proposed scope of briefing, if any, the reasons therefore, and a proposed schedule for any such briefing.

On or before January 12, 2007, Appellants and the Tribe may file responses to the Regional Director's request to limit disclosure of confidential information.
